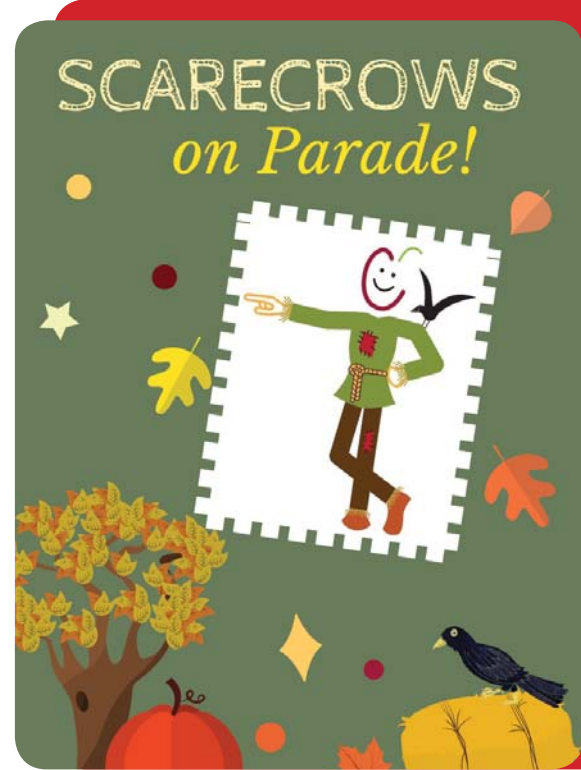
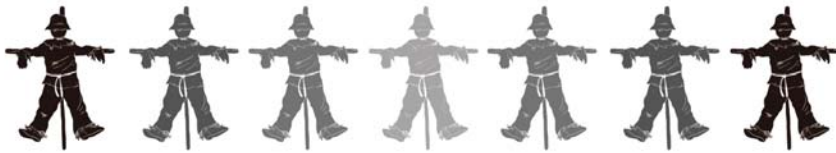

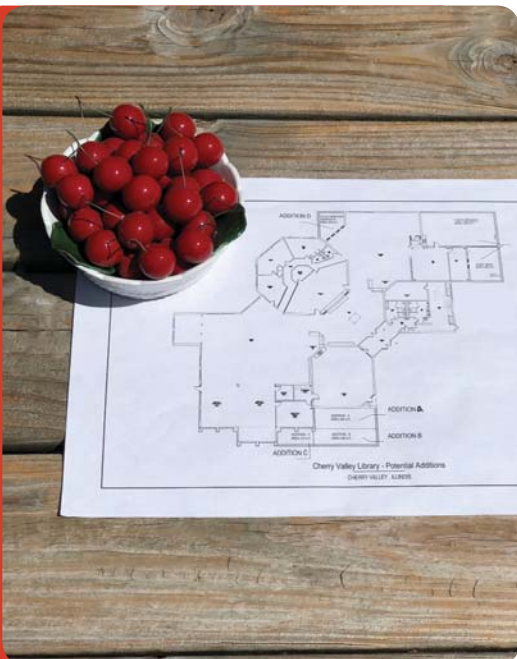

Thursday, October 10 at 10:30am - W.A.S.P., Women's Ambulance Safety Patrol

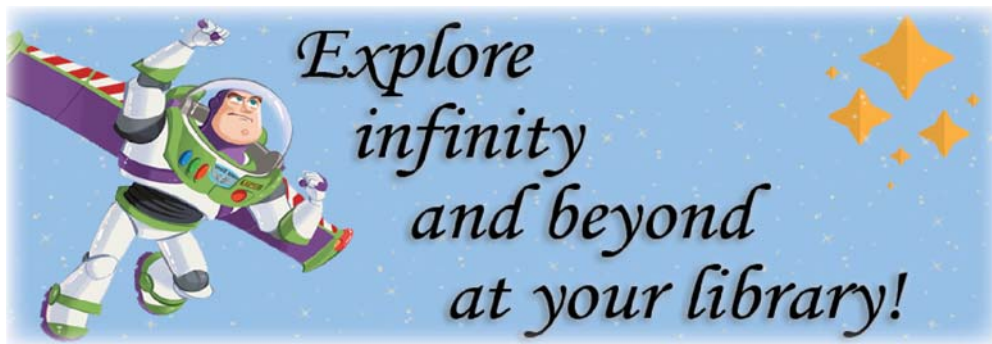
