Become a Friend of the Cherry Valley Public Library!

The Friends of the Cherry Valley Public Library have been supporting the library through fundraising and volunteer efforts for over 45 years. In 2023, the Friends raised almost \$40,000 for the library. These dollars went to funding additional books, materials, equipment, and programs beyond what is provided for by tax dollars.

The Friends' primary source of income is book sales. This includes the large sales in April, September, and December, online book sales through Amazon, and the ongoing fover book sales during regular library hours. In addition to book sales, the Friends also raise money through special events, including Scarecrows on Parade and Mini-Golf in the Library and Silent Auction. Other revenue sources include the mini pop-up shop, holiday book kits, and membership dues.

Volunteer opportunities for Friends of the Cherry Valley Public Library include cleaning and organizing donated books for daily sales, assisting with seasonal book sales (setting up, cashiering, and cleaning up), planning and working at special events, and attending quarterly Friends meetings.

Membership fees are \$5.00 for an individual or book re-seller and \$10.00 for a family or organization. Memberships are good for one year. Benefits of a Friends membership include admission to book sale preview day, a lanyard and recognition buttons, and a quarterly Friends of the Library electronic newsletter.

Can't find the book you're looking for on our shelves? Then, why not download an e-book or audiobook and enjoy it on your favorite device? The library now offers two services for e-books: **Libby** and **e-Read Illinois**. Both are easy to use and offer thousands of titles to choose from.

Libby For **Libby**, download the app on your device. Then, follow the prompts to find the Cherry Valley Public Library and sign

in with a valid library card and PIN. The PIN is the last four digits of your library card, unless you have changed it. Browse the library's collection and borrow a title. Libby items will checkout for 3 weeks.

For **e-Read Illinois** use the **Boundless** app. Select Cherry Valley Public Library District as your library. Sign in using your library card number. Look for your titles

and checkout your materials. e-Read items will checkout for 2 weeks.


Wednesday, June 26 from 9:00am to 4:00pm
