

Art in the Library!

Thanks to Susan and Donna Mays, the Cherry Valley Public Library is the new owner of an original Tom Heflin painting that hasn't been on public display in almost 60 years. Tom was an award-winning artist whose paintings have been featured at exhibitions in New York, Chicago, Seattle, Dallas, and numerous other cities throughout the United States and around the world. The painting, entitled *Uncle Grady*, has been part of the Mays' family private collection for decades.

The portrait depicts Tom's uncle and represents how much family meant to him. Since Tom's passing in 2023, the family has wanted his work to stay in the community so everyone can enjoy it. The family loves the small town feel of the Cherry Valley Public Library, which was very much who Tom was. The library also has a copy of *Roots and Wings: The Art of Tom Heflin*, a thirty-seven year retrospective of paintings and writings composed by the artist.
